Executive Summary

Almost everyone in the world has faced chapped lips. Our team faced them too. So our team wanted to find home remedies for chapped lips. We have chosen lemons, and cucumbers for home remedies, and prescriptions were Vaseline and lotion.

Which one will work the best? How will the environment affect chapped lips? Does the amount of cure applied to the lips matter?

The first step we did was gathering information on chapped lips and the cycle of lips becoming chapped, using a cure, and lips clearing up. Then we tested the remedies on ourselves. After that we tested on other volunteers. Our problem didn't contain very many variables so we used Starlogo TNG for programming.

The variables were: did they get cured, how long did it take, and were there any side effects.

Our programming shows if they were cured, and which remedy cured them.

Method

Our method was to test the remedies on a certain number of people over a certain amount of time. Each subject tested each remedy over a week's period twice a day, at the same time each day. Then they were allowed two weeks to get their lips chapped again and tested the next remedy. They did this until they had tested all four remedies.

We supplied each volunteer with the same form to complete and return to us. Volunteers supplied their own remedies.

Survey forms were given to three eighth grade math teachers for each of their classes to complete. The results were tallied and placed in an Excel worksheet.

Results

Our results showed that Lotion worked the best to cure chapped lips. Then second was lemon, then cucumber, and last Vaseline. They all were tested equally and evenly.
